What do patients want? ### **Focusing on cancer patients' intentions to use ...**

**An Important Question**

Psychoanalytic ideas often underpin other therapeutic approaches, sometimes using different terms Some of the models of therapy and coun-selling have developed his ideas Others have dismissed the more controversial aspects of his theories, but so too have different psychoanalysts, who themselves have taken psychoanalytic theory and practice in different directions Of course, Freudian theory

**Obligation of non-maleficence: moral dilemma in physician ...**

In real life situations physicians do inflict harm on patients but generally for the purpose of achieving some kind of good According to Beauchamp and Childress, a harm we inflict such as a surgical wound may be negligible or trivial yet necessary to prevent a major harm such as death8 Infliction of harm (that is, negligible harm) purposed at arresting harm for the purpose of realising good
